My name is Jim Lundal ('58) and I have created a Web Site under the auspicious of the Silverton High Alumni Association (SHSAA). I suppose having a convenient accessible vehicle to connect with our past high school years stems from some nostalgic moments to the many who, by choice or necessity, have been geographically disconnected after a long time. As for myself, I have lived away from the Silverton area for almost 50 years

and many times wanted to have a handy connection to previous acquaintances, neighbors and classmates and there didn't seem to be a vehicle available to do this. So, in absence of another vehicle I volunteered to the SHSAA to begin an Alumni Web Site. This web site, although still in its infancy, hopefully will provide the many other Silverton High Alumni a communication vehicle to their past classmates and assist the SHSAA in maintaining a connection with those previous classmates.

I moved away from Silverton in November 1958 after graduating from Silverton High the previous June. Another '58 classmate (Rollin Smedstad) and I chose to join the Air Force under a "buddy plan" and this plan only lasted 4 weeks of basic training and we became separated. We never did encounter each other again till probably our 30th High School reunion. Through intervening years, the process to stay-in-touch with some of those in my Class Year became more and more difficult. After completing the Air Force, college in Southern

California, marriage in 1965 (Southern California girl), living in New Orleans for a year, Graduate School in Boston and beginning employment (optical engineer) at Hughes Aircraft Co. in Southern California in 1968, I think I had this "where did the Class of '58 end up?" attitude. SHSAA recently lost a very strong supporter of our organization, Silverton, and SHS when

Norman Kolln died peacefully October 15, of natural causes in Eugene, Oregon. He was 92.

Since 1999, he would often drive to Silverton and stop by Mason’s office to discuss our organization’s success and then he would reach into his shirt pocket and take out a folded blank check. He would then proceed to fill it out in an amount of \$1,000 and wish us the best. At our Annual Garden Party for Alumni and Friends he also would donate \$5,000 to \$10,000. We will miss his smiling face and positive attitude. As a direct result of his tremendous generosity, approximately \$1,350 in scholarships will be awarded annually in perpetuity to SHS graduates.

In 1955, the family moved to Longview, Washington, where they had purchased a motel and restaurant. It was here that Norm and Tiny came up with a recipe for pizza. In 1957, with Norm at the register and Tiny creating the unique ‘gay 90’s’ atmosphere, they opened the first Pietro’s Pizza restaurant next to the motel. It was a huge success.

In 1961, Norm and Tiny moved to Eugene, where they saw the potential for some underused riverside property in Glenwood, which they purchased. They built Pietro’s Gold Coast, which soon became *the* place to go in Eugene. Old timers will remember strolling Pietro’s Alley and riding the merry-go-round outside. Eventually, there were six Pietro’s Pizza restaurants in Oregon and Washington. In 1975, the Kolln’s sold their business to the Campbell Soup Company and retired.

The 8th Annual Alumni & Friends Party at the Oregon Garden Pavilion was a tremendous success because of the overwhelming support of the Silverton and High School Alumni communities. A party can not be successful unless someone attends, so first of all a heartfelt thank you to all of the approximately 400 who attended what continues to be the largest gathering of Silvertonians with an interest in promoting alumni fellowship and scholarship funding.

All of our 2006 Homer Day's activities to include the Party resulted in nearly a \$10,000 gain for the Alumni Scholarship Fund. Our goal is to grow the Fund so that eventually *every graduating senior* will be eligible to receive financial assistance in the form of a scholarship. Currently, the interest earned from the nearly \$240,000 investment resulted in \$12,200 awarded to this year's graduating seniors and alumni of SHS.

Privacy Policy: SHSAA does not sell or trade names and/or addresses of alumni. Our purpose is to keep a current database of all alumni. With this information, we propose to help each class in locating their classmates when they are planning a reunion. We do, however, share the addresses within that class and with other alumni.



SHSAA WEB SITE INFORMATION

SHSFOXES.COM

Web Site: SHSFOXES.COM

The current Web Site format began after viewing the format used on several other existing alumni sites. The key, I believe, for any site structure is to provide a visitor a Home Page with Compartment Titles which allow one to begin maneuvering into a site. Also, a site should allow a method for changing paths while maneuvering inside the site. When you open the site, **Site Compartment Titles** on the **Home Page** are available along the left side of the page. Maneuvering around throughout the Site is accomplished by placing (using your computer mouse) your **Screen Cursor** over the selected Compartment Title (the cursor will become an arrow) and clicking the Mouse. The first page below the clicked compartment title will open up with information or further instructions on how to proceed. Returning back from a selected page is done by clicking **Compartment Title Buttons** at the top of most pages, or, a **UP Button** along each page side. A click on an **UP** button will take you back to a previous page.

The **Compartment Titles** listed on the **Home Page** are explained as follows:

- **Alumni Newsletter:** Judy Nunn's most recent Alumni Association Newsletter is posted. This document is in Acrobat PhotoReader (PDF) and your computer must have this application to open the Newsletter. Acrobat PhotoReader is available online for free and a method for downloading this application will be on the Web Site.
- **Current News:** is a compartment to provide current alumni information. This compartment posts announcements submitted by the Alumni Association about future activities, such as reunion information, any class meetings held on a regular basis, etc.
- **Tributes:** This compartment is intended as a location for alumni to submit Remembrances/Tributes to a deceased alumni. Tributes can be submitted by entering the Home Page **Contact Us** Compartment and submitting a **Deceased Classmate Form**. The submitted form will be reviewed for accuracy and authenticity by the Alumni Association and then posted on the Web Site for others to view.
- **Alumni Lists:** Alumni Lists are named listings by class year for those alumni documented in the Alumni Association database. When **Alumni Lists** is clicked on the **Home Page**, the first page visible explains two types of Alumni Search methods, **1) Automatic Data Entry** and **2) Manual Data Search**. At this time only the **Manual Search** is functional so click on the **Manual Search Button** to the left side.

The next page explains the **Manual Search** listing. Depending on the Class Year a visitor wants to review the alumni, click a button on the left corresponding to the **Year Range** listed on that button. **For example: Class of 1958 would click on button Manual Search 55 – 64.**

The next page which appears lists the **Class Year Buttons** individually along the left side, and Class of 1958 would be clicked for our example above. If you want to return to a previous page or the **Home Page**, click on the appropriate button placed on these pages (**UP** or another **Compartment Title** at the page top).

The alumni lists contained for each Class Year are members currently in the Alumni Association Database. IF a specific alumni is deceased, the alumni's name will be in a plum color with an asterisk. IF a specific alum wants their "contact" information available, that alumni last name will be indicated in a "Red" color. To view this alumni's data, click on the individual's last name and a pop-up window will appear. The data presented on this window can be anything that the alumni has provided permission for the Alumni Association to present. Example: Using the procedure above, go to Class of 1958 and within the listed alumni is the Webmaster, Jim Lundal whose last name is in RED. Click on the last name and view the window on his contact data. To close the window, click on the BACK arrow on your computer.

IF you want your data posted, picture posted (then and/or present) or whatever contact data you decide, send in the appropriate Contact Us form in the **Contact Us** compartment from the **Home Page**. In this case you would use the **Alumni Search Form**. Once you submit your contact data, an Alumni Association member will verify the validity and accuracy before posting the data to the Web Site. Be aware that anyone can view your data so only post data that you don't mind any Web visitor to view.

• **Class Representatives** are volunteers who maintain contact with their members of their Class Year. These representatives usually supply a **Missing List** periodically and the list of **Class Reps** will have contact information in the future. A list of **Class Reps** and contact information is also printed in each **Newsletter**.

• **Missing Alumni Lists:** Clicking the Missing Alumni List compartment button on the Home Page will present a page of selections for which specific Class Year you are interested. Clicking an appropriate Button on the left you will see a span of about 9 years with names listed under each year. The listed names are provided by Alumni that are searching for an individual, Class Reps trying to maintain a complete list for their class or a name which the Alumni Association doesn't have any information on the database. The Missing Alumni Lists on the Web Site are valuable because casual visitors to the lists may know of an individual from another Class Year and supply some information about that alum.

• **Bulletin Board** The Bulletin Board Compartment is for any alumnus that wants to post information for a specific classmate. This compartment would present messages submitted by alums who want to post a message that site visitors might read and assist in an alumni search. This **Bulletin Board** is limited to Classmate information. Announcements about reunions, meetings, etc. are displayed in the **Current News** compartment of the **Home Page**.

• **Contact Us:** This compartment of the **Home Page** (when selected) presents a page which provides a selection of Forms which can be selected for various purposes. The following are those selections:

1) Deceased Classmates: Use this form to submit deceased information about a classmate. This form can also be used to submit a tribute toward a deceased classmate. The submitted data will be reviewed for accuracy by an Alumni Association before posting on the Web.

2) Enter Your Data: Maybe you couldn't find yourself in the Alumni Lists and want to be found. You can submit this form to provide the Alumni Association with your data, and receive the newsletter and provide information to contact you.

3) Bulletin Board: If you want to contact a classmate or provide an announcement to your class about yourself, enter the inquiry on this form and after authentication your announcement will be posted.

4) Alumni Search Form: This form is for a Web visitor to locate another classmate which they want to renew a contact. Submit this form and an Alumni Association member will in turn contact that classmate and **"it is up to the classmate to contact you"**. If no data is available in the Association database, the Association member will contact you to inform that there is no contact information. The primary recourse then is to place a notice on the Bulletin Board and hope someone will read the notice.

5) Association Contact: This contact form is for posting scheduled reunion announcements, meetings, etc. where you want the Association "to get the word out". This might even be a simple get-together you are having with other Classmates weekly or monthly to let your class be aware that you are meeting.

A word about Security

During these times of identity theft and other paranoia, security of your information is of primary importance. When you submit data on the Contact Us forms and the question is asked IF you want your data posted on the Web, think about it! It is the Association's goal to only post data that you want viewed by ANY visitor. When listing addresses, phone numbers, email addresses, etc., think about it before answering YES. We want to maintain contact with classmates and we want to provide each classmate with a means for contacting other classmates, but be cognizant of what you list.

Birdhouses for Rent! Birds are the jewels of the winter garden, and one of our goals is to incorporate more winter interest. So, we are introducing a program which will invite the birds to make our Garden their home. For the fall and winter we will be building and maintaining regular and varied feeding stations. We will also be building nesting boxes and birdhouses to put up in the early spring to encourage our birds to raise a family. Feeding stations and birdhouses may be rented by individuals and then are sublet to the birds. A plaque will be installed on the birdhouse or feeding station specifying whom the landlord is. Birdhouses are already available for rent:

- a. Single dwelling, Chalet style - \$40/year
- b. Single dwelling, Copper Capped Roof - \$50/year
- c. Duplex dwelling, Copper Capped - \$60 (2 apartments)/year
- d. Apartment dwelling, Copper Capped - \$90 (6 apartments)/year
- e. Each house lease comes with a lease agreement, a small plaque on the house and mention in the Avian Real Estate section of the newsletter. Lease is for 1 year, and the birdhouse remains the property of The Oregon Garden.
