Reunion Assistance

Are you thinking of coordinating or hosting your class' next reunion? Our Association can help you. We offer the following assistance:

- 1. In a perfect world, if all of our classmates paid their \$5 annual dues and received our SHSAA newsletter every November and May, then we would have a complete and up to date list of members and their addresses. We do have some addresses and will provide that list to you. We ask that you give us the benefit of your labor and provide us with any updated addresses as you find them.
- 2. In the calendar year preceding your scheduled reunion we will include your class in our twice annual mailing at no cost to you, if we get the corrected addresses at least 30 days before the 3rd Tuesday in April and 3rd Tuesday in October.
- 3. Additionally, should you wish to include a personalized flyer with information directed to your special classmates, then we will produce

- mailing labels for your class and ask that you attend our "mailing meetings" in May and November to insert your flyers. We will include your classmates in our bulk mailing at no cost to you.
- 4. We encourage you to write an article for the general information of all alumni in addition to your classmates. Who knows? Perhaps someone out there will know just where to find the heretofore lost classmates.
- 5. If you decide to hold your reunion during our SHS Alumni and Friends Garden Party, which is always the first Friday in August, then we will actually do most of the coordination for the facility reservations, caterer, etc.
- 6. The normal method is for someone in your class to collect the admission fee from your classmates and then purchase the tickets in bulk from our SHS office at 303 Oak St. in Silverton as soon as is possible, but *please* no later than 10 days before the Garden Party. We have to order meals from the caterer and not knowing until the last few days before the event is not good planning.

- 7. By collecting the ticket requests, you determine just who and how many from your class to expect at the Party.
- 8. In the morning between 9:00 and 10:00 a.m. on the day of the event, someone from your class must be present to reserve tables at ten people per table. If you purchase 22 tickets you are then permitted to reserve two tables on a first come first reserved basis. You might want to make some kind of table decoration to say, "Reserved for the Class of _____". Note that NO "lighter than air balloons" are allowed. Also, no signs can be attached to the walls. Colored table cloths and stand-up signs are suggested for the tables.
- 9. On Friday night, someone from your class should be at the admission door and available to hand out the tickets to your classmates. Some classes make special identity tags for their classmates. Anyone who shows up and needs to purchase a ticket is welcome; however, tickets bought on the day of the event cost an additional \$5.00. Tickets are available at the door.
- 10. The bars are pay as you go for beer, wine and liquor. We will normally have soft drinks available at no cost.
- 11. The cafeteria style meal is included in your admission fee.

You can see that together we can help you have a great time at the Alumni & Friends Garden Party. One of the joys of the gathering is that you will see more people than you can possibly find the time to

It's More Than Food!

The Association makes \$1.36 per attendee when one considers the \$25 dollar ticket sales income and weigh that against the actual monetary costs to hold the Alumni and Friends Garden Party. However, the generous donations, sponsorships and hard work of the Silent Auction and 50/50 Teams truly make the Party a fund raising event. The bottom line for our 2008 Party was \$10,761 scholarship dollars which were awarded to SHS graduating seniors in the Class of 2008 and alumni who are pursuing their undergraduate studies across the nation.

We would have normally included a Ticket Order Form in this Newsletter for the 2009 Alumni and Friends Party; however, as this article is being written, we do not know for certain how and where the 11th Annual Alumni and Friends Garden Party will be held. When we attempted to make our reservation for the first Friday in August 2009, we were faced with the reality that the new management of the Oregon Garden must operate their facilities for a profit – just like any other business and we are facing additional expenses above and beyond our expected normal rent.

The Association Trustees had determined in a post-party analysis meeting that the 2009 ticket prices needed to be increased to \$30 just to cover the suspected increases in expenses for next year, even if we were to continue in the same place at the same time. But we did not predict that the Garden's costs would also include exclusive catering services. If we are to hold our party at the Garden and also include the Garden's fees associ-

ated with our customary buffet, then the price of the tickets could double and still not net much more in ticket sales than break even. Additionally, we would lose the generous sponsorship from the Wooden Nickel which reduces our meal expenses to just about the Nickel's wholesale costs.

We are looking into the organization of our 2009 event and haven't completed our investigation that includes alternate locations, choice of caterer, menu selection and price of admission. Additional facts are that almost all other fund raising events similar to our Party have long lists of sponsors so that the price of attendance is held down and most of the money that is raised does not go to the organization expenses. We have not asked for corporate sponsorships and maybe that must also change with the times.

So, the bottom line at this time is that the Trustees are faced with some serious discussions over the next few meetings and any persons who would like to participate is warmly invited to attend our normal meetings that are held on the 3rd Tuesday of each month. We recommend that you confirm with any of our Trustees (a list is on page 3) prior to your planning to attend just to ensure that the meeting is as scheduled. Please note there is no meeting in December.

So many memories, I could write a book! Here are some memories of those wonderful years in Eugene Field School and a few from Jr. High.

It was fall and maple leaves were falling all about; I would stop and pick the prettiest to take to Mrs. Alfred, my first grade teacher. We were always early and stood by the side door on Park and Water Street for the doors to open at 8 o'clock. Mrs. Alfred was very young and enthusiastic.

Second grade brought me to Miss Silver's room. She seemed old but likely wasn't. Spring brought the class project to build bird houses; when we finished we were all lined up for our picture to be taken with them. (If you don't already know, that photo went to Portland to the Historical Society as one of June Drake's, so we are historical). This was the year we took a field trip across the street to June Drake's studio. We filed in single file as the floors, tables, and everything was piled high with his photos. It was a wonderful experience. Miss Silver also played the piano, banjo and other instruments.

My teacher in the third grade was Miss Hanson. I remember learning to write cursive all those pages of a's, b's and so on. We never were allowed to print. Later in years I realized that when we moved to Silverton we had bought her family home on Rock Street. Lunch time we would walk quietly single file on the left hand side of the hall to the lunch room, which were the two last rooms on the right near the doors of Park and First Street. Lunches were wonderful, especially the mashed potatoes, turkey, gravy, vegetable, and milk.

Fourth grade was Mrs. Erickson. I remember there was some sort of fitness test we had to take. Something about holding one foot in your hand and jumping through the circle. I wasn't able to do it and had to stay

after school to try, but finally seeing I was never going to accomplish this, I was sent on home.

The great fear was to get Miss Brye - she was a strict and hard teacher. I hoped all hope that I wouldn't get her, but yes, here I was in her class. I found out it really wasn't that bad. She made us all memorize poems; one was "I shall never see a poem as lovely as a tree."

Each year we had a program and one of the things I remember most was winding the May Pole. We had such fun winding our paper streamers around the pole for our parents to watch from the balcony above in the gym.

Sixth grade we girls terrorized our man teacher, Mr. Mulhouse. (I think that's the correct spelling). He was very shy - I guess his wife hadn't told him what a bunch of girls could be like, and well, he didn't come back the next year!

Somewhere along the way the lunch room had been moved down to the basement at the far end of the school by the upper grades. The food was still great. We had little milk bottles that had round thin cardboard

lids on them. We would save our lids for recess and throw them trying to get them to land on previously thrown lids.

Mr. Ford was the Principal. Some of the other teachers were Miss Olson, Miss Foss, Mrs. Waterson, Miss Ross, Mrs. Hug and Miss Gregerson. There was a strong, active Parent Teacher Association in the school system.

Jr. High was across the road in the tall red brick building, next to the Washington Irving building that had been condemned, but was still standing. Early mornings brought "Little Jeep" and its two riders, Mr. and Mrs. Woodall. There were always kids around waiting for their arrival, as they always cheerfully greeted the students. Mr. Woodall was the principal and Mrs. Woodall taught P.E. We always had to dress down in clean white shorts and blouses for P.E., which was in the Eugene Field Gym and we showered in the basement. In the spring Mrs. Woodall would have the girls put on a program where she tried to teach us all to be synchronized, but I for one was usually out of step. Some of the other teachers were: Miss Hallock, Mrs. Brandt, Mr. Funk, Mr. McNatt, and Miss Silver.
