Mason toyed with the idea for several years in the mid 1990's with a committee of three (me, myself, and I) until 1996 when David Gentry Class of '55 became the second member followed by Arthur Beesley class of '54, Fritz Skirvin class of '56, Jeanette Olafson class of '57, Mary Ann Miles class of '52, Lawrence Fisher class of '48 and Judy Nunn class of '60. Since then the Silverton High School Alumni Association was formed and Incorporated and has a 501(c)(3) tax designation so contributions are deductible. There are approximately 1,000 paid members and thousands more on our mailing list and growing after each of our bi-annual newsletters.

The first Scholarship Award was \$100 and Mason contributed half of that amount.

We will be awarding 25 Scholarships to this year's graduating class totaling \$13,750. Interest earned from our perpetual Scholarship Fund, which has now grown to over \$271,000 in eleven years. Contributions have ranged from \$5.00 to as much as \$50,000.

Mason has been the backbone of

the Association through thick and thin over the years and continues to do so today. He is a very dedicated individual. At the March meeting, Mason was presented with a plaque from the members, officers and trustees of SHSAA.

# Accommodations in Silverton

There are many options when you are returning to Silverton for a class reunion. Many of you will stay with parents or family residing in or near Silverton. Others will need to find a hotel, motel or perhaps travel by RV. How about a B&B?

### **Silverton Inn & Suites:**

As of February 2008, there are twelve rooms, varying from one to three queen sized beds. Eleven rooms also include a kitchen. Four more rooms should be complete by

mid-summer. All rooms are non-smoking and no pets allowed.

Room rates begin at \$99 plus 10% lodging tax.

During the summer months we fill up quickly so early reservations are advisable. Management does not usually offer package deals, but you can always call to speak with Sisina as she is the Manager.

We are happy to work with our customers to guarantee a pleasant visit.

#### **Adams House:**

Edward Adams House is a Queen Anne home with hosts who will treat you royally. It was built in 1890 and has been refurbished in period decor — with an emphasis on comfort.

Each of the three guest rooms has a cozy queen bed and private, attached bathroom. A full breakfast is served in the formal dining room in the morning.

- \* Check-in is between 4 and 7 p.m., but we are happy to accommodate your schedule by prior arrangement. We hate to see you leave, but check-out is at 11 a.m.
- \* A full breakfast is served at 8:30 a.m. again, we can accommodate your schedule by prior arrangement and special dietary needs are gladly met.
- \* We're sorry, but we have no facilities for pets or children.
- \* Smoking is allowed on the front porch or in the gazebo only.
- \* A deposit of one-half room rate, per room, is requested refundable up to a week from your scheduled date. We accept cash and

## New Donor Recognition Program Established

It rained most of the day on July 17, 2007. It was not a good day for working in the yard, hiking around Silver Creek Falls or going on a picnic. So I sat at my desk and thought about the Alumni Association board meeting coming up that evening. I am not a trustee or an officer of the association, but I am a fan of its main objective which is to raise money for scholarships. It occurred to me that most organizations with similar fund raising objectives have structured programs to encourage and recognize various levels of donor participation - Platinum Donors, Gold Donors, Silver Donors, Bronze Donors, etc. while the only recognition we provided was Lifetime Member which we award to all donors of \$500 or more. In addition all supporters of our annual silent auction were given equal recognition whether their donation was valued at \$5 or \$1,000.

At the meeting that evening I recommended that a committee be formed to consider this situation and make recommendations. A committee was subsequently appointed consisting of Mason Branstetter ('63), Tracy Duerst ('79), Mark Hannan ('84), Carmen Smith ('61), and me ('61).

The committee did research into what other organizations do and into the contributions made by donors to our organization and had a couple of intense meetings to consider donor recognitions programs. On August 18, 2007 we made our recommendations to the board. After thoughtful consideration the following recommenda-

tions were approved at the February 19, 2008 meeting:

Scholarship Fund Donation Recognition Levels

Five levels of donors with names and associated benefits are established as follows:

### Founder (\$20,000 and up)

Founder's plaque at Silverton High School

Lifetime membership in SHSAA Listing in SHSAA newsletter

# Benefactor (\$5,000 to less than \$20,000)

Benefactor's plaque at Silverton High School

Lifetime membership in SHSAA Listing in SHSAA newsletter

# **Sponsor** (\$2,000 to less than \$5,000)

Sponsor's plaque at Silverton High School

Lifetime membership in SHSAA Listing in SHSAA newsletter

### Partner (\$500 to less than \$2,000)

Lifetime membership in SHSAA Listing in SHSAA newsletter

# Friend (More than \$0 to less than \$500)

Listing in SHSAA newsletter

### Named Scholarships

One Time Named Scholarships. The minimum donation for a one time named scholarship should be \$500.

20 Year Named Scholarships.
These scholarships will pay out 5% of the donated amount (minimum \$20,000) each year for 20 years.
The donor of a named scholarship must provide a bio of the person for whom the scholarship is named and must accept the SHSAA guidelines for selection of recipients.

Silent Auction Donor Classification levels are being considered for implementation in 2009.

Much work remains to be done. We will need to review all donations made to date, establish a system for updating this information, contact previous donors to determine whether they wish to be recognized or anonymous, establish a donor recognition area for plaques at the high school, etc.

If all goes well, we should have the recognition program for individuals in place by the end of 2008.
