Alumni and Friends Garden Party Changed to Alumni Scholarship Fundraiser

Our "first Friday in August" annual Alumni Scholarship Fundraiser event, formerly called the Alumni and Friends Garden Party has moved to a new location. We will be at the Willamette Valley Events Center in Mt. Angel and we also have a new name to more accurately reflect the

main purpose as well as the new location. We are holding our 11th annual **Alumni Scholarship** Fundraiser on Friday August 7th in Mt. Angel.

The Association's **Board of Trustees** faced a major challenge while planning for our annual fundraiser party. The new management of the Garden Resort implemented new exclusive caterer policies that adversely effected

continuing with our 11th annual Alumni and Friends Garden Party at the Pavilion. We were going to be required to use their catering services or pay a \$15 surcharge to use the caterer of our choice. Faced with a critical increase in costs of between \$6,000 to \$9,000 it became obvious that an alternate location had to be found.

sive caterer policy critically increased the Alumni's expenses which resulted in the necessary move. After several inquiries, the Trustees unanimously decided to move the venue to the Willamette Valley Events Center (WVEC) in Mt. Angel. The Events Center is the

also very valuable and a major reason that the price for attendance is much lower than other similar events.

However, even with the move the Trustees have decided that the price has to be raised to \$30 for tickets purchased on or before August 6th and \$35 for tickets purchased on August 7th the day of the event. Last year when all the accounting was completed while excluding the Auction and 50/50 activities we had a net profit of less than \$1.50 per

> attendee - not exactly what is expected for a fund raising event.

Our fundraiser is more than just food! When most of us were working our way through school, one could nearly earn enough during the summer to finance our education. Now that seasonal effort is far short of the typical financial needs. We hope that our scholarship will not only provide that little extra financial assistance need but also prove to be a seed that will grow into

a tradition of inter-generational support.

The Silent Auction and 50/50 Raffle have proven to approximately meet our annual scholarship allotment needs. The indirect result of these successful activities is to keep the price of admission low. A special thank you to everyone who

Honorary Diplomas for 2009

Dr. Gordon G. McNeilly

Dr. McNeilly has long been one of Silverton's most beloved citizens. He was a family physician in Silverton for 35 years ending in March 1986 when fire severely damaged his Water St. office. Many longtime Silverton residents have stories about Dr. McNeilly's compassion for his patients and his willingness to go the extra mile to assure they were cared for. He made frequent house calls at any time of the day or night. The McNeillys first came to Silverton in 1951 after a volunteer assignment seeing to the needs of leprosy victims on Tinian Island north of Guam.

The McNeillys were charter members of the Silverton Baptist Church and hosted numerous Bible study meetings at their Mill Street home for Silverton-Salem area Christians of college age. Over the years the McNeillys did volunteer service to needy populations throughout the world – in Zimbabwe, Mexico and among Alaskan Indians to name just a few. This service continued for more than 10 years following "retirement" from his practice in Silverton.

He and his wife, Lois, who worked as an RN in her husband's office throughout the years, live in a modest house on Mill Street in Silverton across the street from the home where they raised their three daughters, all graduates of Silverton High School: Miriam ('63), Ruth ('68), and Marilyn ('70).

Dr. McNeilly was more than just an involved parent. He was a member of the 7J School Board for ten years and served twice as its chairman. His term spanned the entire time that his daughters were in high school.

Susan Fisher

Sue Fisher began her educational career at Silverton High School as a student teacher under the late Jerry Ott. Hired in the fall of 1979, Sue taught Vocational Agriculture and shared the responsibility of advising the Silverton FFA Chapter for three years. She temporarily left the school district in 1982 to raise her children, Sara, Ryan, Staci, and Erik all Silverton High School graduates—Erik in the Class of 2009. Sue returned to Silverton High School as a Vocational Teaching Assistant working with Ag and Business classes in 1990. Sue's teaching career at Silverton High School has included instruction in Agriculture, Personal Finance, coordinating the Elementary Assistant Program with Silver Falls School District Elementary Schools and coordinating the Structured Work Experience Program with Silverton community businesses.

For many years now, Sue has been part of the high school counseling team as the College/ Career Counselor facilitating our students as they prepare for life beyond Silverton High School. She has been the "hub" for students and parents for questions and answers regarding ACT and SAT *Testing, College Prep—visitations,* admissions, and financial aid. Sue alone has spent endless hours searching for scholarship monies at the local, state, and national levels for Silverton seniors as they look to further their post-high school careers. She is also the military contact for young men and women at Silverton seeking to serve their country in all areas of the armed forces.

In addition to school activities, Sue serves on the Oregon State University E.R. Jackman Board, has been a Field Force Coordinator for the United States Military Academy, and Coordinated State FFA Activities under State FFA Advisor, Gordon Galbraith, from 1982-1990.

As Mason reported in the December newsletter, the first step is to contact the Alumni Association for a list of your classmates' addresses. Compare our list to what you have and let us help you determine the most recent addresses.

When our newsletters are sent out via bulk mail, the Post Office returns those that are not deliverable and/or have a change of address. They do not forward the newsletters. If the Post Office has a new address for the recipient, that is indicated on the returned newsletter and we in turn update the database.

Quite often you can find a person online using Switchboard.com (Note: DO NOT put the www. in that search engine or it will take you to the wrong website.) Classmates.com is sometimes helpful. Another website is www.whitepages.com and worth checking out or contact relatives of that missing classmate.

Once you have compared the lists, make the corrections or changes on the list that we sent you and return it to us. If you send your list to us, then we have to check each name and address - doubling the work. It's much more efficient to simply give us the changes. If there are only a few, then Emailing the changes is easiest. Our database is set up in a rather sophisticated Access database and there isn't a way to simply import a file from Excel or other program.

The next step is to send a list of "missing classmates" to me, the Editor of the Silverton Alumni News. I will print the list in the

next newsletter. Hopefully friends and relatives will recognize someone in that "missing" list and contact you with a new address. You'll see there are several "missing" lists in this newsletter.

Check your calendars and join us for a wonderful traditional event that is in its eleventh year. Your attendance will also assist us in raising scholarship money for the next graduating class from ol' Silverton High. To date we have given out \$68,250 in tuition assistance to SHS grads.

So, encourage your class to join us on the first Friday in August and have fun raising funds for scholarships. The annual get-together is our *only* fundraiser. Many classes hold their reunions at the same time. Hey! You don't have to worry about where to hold your reunion, where to get the food, or even collect the money! Just set your reunion to coincide with our annual fundraiser and you're all set!

Astronaut Invents Zero-G Coffee Cup

Can A Starbucks Onboard The ISS Be Far Behind?

Never mind \$100,000 toolbags and troublesome water reclamation units. NASA Astronaut Don Pettit (below) has come up with a RE-ALLY useful invention: a zero-gravity cup that allows spacefarers to enjoy their coffee properly.

Reuters reports Pettit — a former flight engineer on the International Space Station, who is also part of the current STS-126 crew onboard Endeavour — came up with the idea by tinkering with a sheet of transparent plastic, folding it into the shape of an airplane's wing and then taping the sides together.

He perfected the device while onboard the ISS this month, so he could enjoy his coffee as he normally would on Earth.

"The way this works is the crosssection of this cup looks like an airplane wing. The narrow angle here will wick the coffee up," Pettit explained in a NASATV video conference. "We can sip most of the fluid out of these cups and we no longer have to drink our beverages sucking through a straw in a pouch."

Pettit's self-made sippy cup has become a hit with his fellow astronauts. On Thursday, he constructed another cup for fellow crew member Stephen Bowen... and both men used their cups to toast Pettit's Thanksgiving proclamation, which included giving thanks for space exploration and "just because we're in space and we can."

Should Pettit's cup design win favor with NASA (which may be a long shot... given that it's a simple, elegant, and inexpensive solution — Ed.) it could become part of the normal equipment complement onboard the agency's spacecraft, and the ISS.

And that's an idea that's easy to swallow... even knowing that coffee may be brewed with recycled urine.
