

Softball Hall of Fame

Deloris Hanson '58, known to most of us as "Shorty", has been inducted into the Oregon ASA Hall of Fame for "Fast pitch". The trophy was awarded at a ceremony on December 6, 2014.

In 1956 she was all-star first baseman. In 1957 she was all-star shortstop and won the trophy for outstanding player at the state tournament.

In 1958 she won the regional trophy for best hitter in the Northwest tournament.

After high school, Shorty played softball for the Salem Shamrocks for six years, collecting a trophy for being the leading hitter of the 1959 season. Her batting average was .444, described as "fabulous".

Deloris participated in ASA softball for 14 years, all in fast pitch. Starting out at first base, she soon earned a reputation as being one of the most skilled shortstops in the Northwest Women's Major Softball League in the 1950s and 1960s. Not only was she a superb defensive player, but she was also a great hitter, fast runner, and all-around player.

During this time, Shorty competed in 12 ASA state tournaments, 6 ASA regional tournaments, and 2 ASA world tournaments. She was one of the most decorated female softball athletes ever from the state of Oregon.

Shorty's many, many honors are impressive, to say the least, and she is truly one of the great women "pioneers" of ASA softball in Oregon and the Pacific Northwest.

Norma Jean Standlea came to Silver Falls School District in 1992 after teaching in Newport, Oregon for nine years and in Colton for one. She taught Language Arts at Mark Twain for three years and then moved to the high school in 1995 to work under principals Dick Kromminga, Darlene Beyerle, Dale Koger, Jodi Drescher, and Mark Hannan. Norma Jean served as an English Department chairperson for ten years, and on the district Language Arts Committee working to align and coordinate curriculum for all students.

Over the years, she taught all levels of English from freshmen through seniors including College Writing 121 & 122, which prepared over 500 students for the rigors of writing in college and gained them college credit as well. To help improve instruction and student performance at Silverton High School, Norma Jean took many advanced classes, worked with the Oregon Department of Education developing reading, writing, and speaking assessments, and spent many nights and weekends fine-tuning lessons and providing extensive feedback to students. She regularly read college admissions and scholarship essays for students, and encouraged their pursuit of higher education in addition to their development of critical thinking skills. A passion of hers was creating community and connections through Advisory Group, and she proudly saw her first four-year Advisory Family through to graduation in 2013. Norma Jean retired

in 2014 after 31 years of teaching, but continues to offer her services to assist students and the Silverton High School English department whenever possible.

Marcia Brooks Branstetter

Marcia Branstetter has been a very active participant in SHS Alumni activities since returning to town with her husband and family in 1989 following their 26 years' service in the military. Her energetic spirit and dedication to community has been evidenced by her participation in many community organizations to include: Silver Falls School District facilities planning, Senior Center planning, development and Board, just to name a few.

She is an active volunteer in many facets of SHS Alumni activities to include being the initiator and source of the item that is raffled during the annual Scholarship Fundraiser.

Marcia, a Tillamook High School graduate, is credited with bringing the concept of SHS Class Reunions being conducted during Homer Davenport weekend to Silverton. During the SHS Class of 1963's 30-year planning session, she introduced the fact that the THS classes have traditionally held their reunions during the Tillamook County Fair week. So the Homer weekend reunion concept seed was planted and has grown since 1993.

Here is an update on the Festhalle per Lori Pavlicek. Lori is on the fund raising committee and past member of the Oktoberfest Board.

The second phase of the Mt. Angel Community Festhalle is taking off; this phase will finish the area above the kitchen over to above the restrooms at the North end. When finished, it will include a Community Meeting Room with Association closets for storage lining the outside of the room, a Board room, bathrooms and an elevator. The Community Room will have a capacity of 158, but will hold 75+ comfortably and the Board room will hold around 30. Both rooms will be available for public use. Eventually, historical displays of Oktoberfest's past will line the walls, and a large wall monitor to use for Power Point presentations will be added.

Currently, we are waiting for county permits, so the current Oktoberfest Board is prepping the area for the heating and fire sprinkler systems. In April the walls will be framed and by June it should be sheet rocked and ready for the elevator.

Show me the

Money!

How much money has been awarded to how many alumni of SHS by our Association?

Our first scholarship - way back in 1996 was for \$100. It is noteworthy that twenty years ago \$100 lasted a much longer in one's budget than today; however, one hundred dollars was all we could afford since it represented approximately 11% of our total assets. In fact the first award was to have been \$50 so as to be closer to a sustainable distribution of 5% of our assets. One of our members added a personal donation to bring it to a more respectable - \$100.

We gradually increased our invested principal and followed the original scholarship with a \$300 scholarship the next year and in 1998 we awarded \$600. Our momentum was increasing.

In 2005, we started collaborating with the SHS Scholarship Fund to become more efficient and effective in the management of a SHS scholarship system with a purpose to distribute the awards to a greater number of students. One of our goals was to see more students receive assistance instead of a few double-dipping on available resources.

After approximately five years in this cooperative effort, the Board of Directors for the SHS Scholarship Fund agreed with the Alumni Trustees' proposal of merging our organizations. Through this merger we were to able exponentially increase our effectiveness while reducing our redundant administrative duties and expenses.

The combination of our scholarship investments became more effective and we realized a much

better return on what had been two smaller individual accounts.

Our Association has also assumed the local responsibility for the distribution of scholarship awards from the Dr. P. A. Loar Fund presently managed by the Nevada Trust Center of Wells Fargo Bank. Through our efforts, we assure a continued distribution of scholarship money to Silverton citizens as originally intended by Dr. Loar. Without our persistence, those scholarship monies would probably just sit and compound in the Wells Fargo Bank and would never be available as intended.

During the 19 year history of our Association, to include the 10 years of collaborative effort with the Wells Fargo Bank, we have provided over \$600,000 in scholarships to just under 800 alumni of SHS.

Our assets have grown from the \$900 remaining from the Class of 1963's 30th Reunion in 1993 to nearly \$1,100,000 in 2015.

Foxes Basketball Season Summary

After a 1st round play-off defeat that kept the Foxes out of the 2014 state tournament, the returning players from that team were determined to go further. Buoyed by the success and experience of football team, who played in the state title game, the boys basketball team entered the season with a lot of confidence. A late football season and a tough non-league schedule resulted in a 2-3 record before the Foxes started to get some traction.

A 16 point victory over a strong Marist team on January 6 was a turning point in the team's confidence just prior to the opening of league play. That confidence and a favorable home schedule in the first several games of league play propelled the Foxes to a 4-0 record before the Central Panthers came to town, also boasting a 4-0 record. The Panthers took control of the game in the third quarter, building their lead to 15 points. But the Foxes rallied with full court pressure and were able to regain momentum and tied the game just before the end of regulation. They then took control in overtime, hitting free throws to win by nine.

From there the team rolled to a 9-0 record in league before heading to Corvallis. Despite a first round 21 point victory by the Foxes, the Spartans used physical defense to get revenge in a 49-55 victory. But the Foxes quickly rebounded to dominate the rest of the league schedule, including another overtime victory against Central, capturing the Mid-Willamette Conference title with three games to go and ultimately finishing 13-1 in league.

Ranked #4 in the state at that point, the Foxes earned a first-round

bye and home playoff game against La Salle Catholic, a big and talented team. Depending on tough defense yet again, the Foxes held the Falcons to 37 points and earned a trip to the 5A State Tournament at Gill Coliseum.

The Foxes met Churchill in the quarterfinal game, struggling to a 13-21 halftime deficit. When starters Sam Roth and Logan Munson fouled out mid-way through the fourth quarter, the outcome looked bleak. But reserve players Nathan Jamsa and Blake Cosgrove stepped in to help the team overcome a 7 point deficit in the final five minutes and win the game 46-41.

In a defensive championship game, the Foxes were tested by the #1 ranked defense of the Wilsonville Wildcats. The Wildcats were also in for a serious examination by the #2 ranked defense of the Silverton Foxes. Scoring didn't come at all easy until the two teams traded scores in the waning minutes, with tension building until the last second. The Foxes did begin to feel a victory after a missed Wilsonville free throw which lead to a one point victory. The win was the culmination of hard work, excellent team dedication and outstanding support resulted in jubilation for the team and the town of Silverton, at



On fire from deep, the team hit a tournament record 12 three-pointers in the midst of their best game of the year. Able to withstand a strong charge by the Cougars, the Foxes pulled away at the end for a 59-51 victory. The Foxes were led by the aggressiveness of Cole Chandler, along with the scoring of Sam Roth (17 pts.) and the shooting of Julian Downey (5 three-pointers).

the buzzer, for the first boys' state title in 105 years.

The Foxes finished the season on a 20-1 run, with a season record of 22-4. Next year's team will sorely miss this year's seven seniors, including starters Cole Chandler, Logan Munson, and Trevor Cote'. Other graduating seniors are Nathan Jamsa, Alex Reutov, Dylan Davis, and Matthew Peters. Not to worry though, the team returns the top three scorers, including 1st team all-tournament and MWC Player of the Year Sam Roth, 2nd team all-league

Danny Larionov, and 2nd team alltournament Julian Downey.

On April 2, 2015, the team was honored at the State Capitol on the Senate floor. Senator Fred Girod introduced the team as State Champions for 2015, and read each of their names.

The Foxes were coached by alumnus' Steve Roth (class of '82), Brent Satern ('04), Doug Roth ('85), and Jason Martin ('10). See you next year!

Green Tomato Jam/Jelly

Grind enough green tomatoes to make 5 cups. Add 3 1/2 cups sugar and 3 tbslp. lemon juice (from jar).

Boil for o20 mins. Add one large box of strawberry or raspberry Jell-O. Stir well and put into pint jars with lids. Set jars into hot water bath for 15 mins.

Pickled Beans

(from a friend of mine, Shirley)

2 lb. green beans (makes 4 pints) 2 tsp. cayenne pepper

4 cloves garlic4 heads dill

2 1/2 cups water 2 1/2 cups vinegar

1/4 cup salt

Pack green beans in jars; put dill & clove garlic in bottom and top of jars. Divide ingredients between the 4 jars. Boil water, vinegar & salt, add to the 4 jars. Process in boiling water bath for 10 minutes. Leave set for at least 10 days before using.

German Cabbage

Donna Krug Ramseyer Liechty '41

4 Tbsp. bacon fat

3/4 c. vinegar

3 lg. onions, chopped

3/4 c. water

1 med. head chopped red cabbage

3/4 c. sugar

Saute onions in bacon fat in large skillet. Add chopped cabbage and cook 20 minutes, stirring. Add water, vinegar and suagr and steam covered 30 to 60 minutes - slow. You may have to add more water and sugar and vinegar to taste.

Goes very well with Oktoberfest sausage or pork.

Sauerkraut Dish

Donna Krug Ramseyer Liechty '41 4 strips bacon4 or more potatoes 1 lb. ground beef nutmeg to taste

1 qt. sauerkraut

Cut bacon in small pieces and fry 3-5 minutes. Add ground beef to (electric) skillet and cook with bacon until no more red shows. Turn several times so that beef and bacon are mixed together. Drain the sauerkraut and rinse with water to cut sourness. Spread sauerkraut over meat. Sprinkle with nutmeg according to taste. (I use a generous amount.)

Turn skillet to simmer and cook 1 hour. While kraut and meat are cooking, pare and cook potatoes. When tender, mash potatoes. As soon as sauerkraut is finished, spread potatoes over kraut and meat. Dot with butter or margarine and serve. This is a Dutch dish.

Baked Beans

2 #2 1/2 cans pork & beans

1/2 lb. lean bacon

2 med. onions

1/2 cup brown sugar

1 lg. green pepper

2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

1 cup catsup

Cut bacon into pieces and cut onion & peppers into chunks. Combine all ingredients. Bake covered at 325° for 3 hours, stirring occasionally. Remove cover for the last 30 minutes to brown. (A recipe from my niece).

Corn Pudding

1 can corn

2 beaten eggs

1 1/4 cup sweet milk

1 pt. tomatoes

1 cup corn meal

1 small onion minced fine

1 Tbs. paprika

1 tsp. salt

1 sweet green pepper (1/2 can pimentoes may be substituted)

1/2 pt. olives

1/4 lb. butter

Bake in buttered dish very slowly at least an hour.

This was my mother's corn pudding that was on the table for every holiday or if company was coming.

Blackberry Cordial

1 cup whole, fully ripe blackberries, fresh or frozen, unsugared

1 cup sugar

1 cup vodka

1 1.5 liter or larger wine jug, washed well, with cork stopper or screw top

Wash blackberries gently and drain. Put sugar and vodka into jug. Do not fill too full. Drop berries into jug and seal securely. Shake well. Keep in coo, dark place and shake vigorously every day for six weeks. Strain mxture through cheesecloth and pour into bottle for gift giving. Note: The recipe may be increased for greater quantities as long as the proportions remain the same.

Raspberry Punch

1 pkg. raspberry Kool-Aid

3/4 cup sugar

2 quarts water

1/2 gal. cranberry juice

1 lg. can pineapple juice

1 quart raspberry sherbert

1 quart 7-up

Buttermilk Chicken

1 cup buttermilk

1 tsp. hot pepper sauce

salt & pepper

3/4 grated parmesean cheese (2 1/2 oz.)

1 tsp. dried thyme

4 pounds chicken parts

1. Preheat oven to 400°. Generously rub baking sheet with oil. Pulse bread until it turns coarse.

2. In large bowl, mix buttermilk, hot pepper, 3/4 tsp salt, 1/2 gtsp. pepper. In separate bowl mix crumbs, parmesean, thyme, 3 1/8 tsp. pepper.

3. Place chicken in buttermilk mixture. Coat evenly one piece at a time. Then dredge in crumb mix. Place on baking sheet. Bake until chicken is golden brown, about 35 minutes.

Piccalilli

Nellie Graves '56

6 lb. (22 med.) green tomatoes

6 green peppers

6 sweet red peppers

3/4 lb. (1 pint) small onions,

peeled

1 1/2 qt. distilled white vinegar

3 1/2 cups sugar

1/4 cup salt

1/3 cup mustard seed

1 1/2 tsp. ground allspice

1 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon

3 to 4 tsp. celery seed

Wash tomatoes and peppers. Trim, quarter tomatoes; seed and quarter peppers. Put tomatoes, peppers & onions through food grinder, discarding juices. In large kettle pour 1 qt. vinegar over vegetables; boil 30 minutes, stirring often. Drain, discarding liquid. Return vegetables to kettle; add remaining vinegar, sugar, salt & spices. Sim-

mer 3 minutes, continuing simmering while quickly pakeing one hot, sterilized jar at a time. Fill within 1/8" from top. Seal each jar at once. Makes 6-7 pints.

Apple Pudding

1 cup sugar

1 cup flour

1/4 cup shortening

1 tsp. soda

1 egg 1 tsp. soda

1/2 c. cream or canned milk

1 tsp. cinnamon

4 tart apples or 1 pt. canned fruit

1 tsp. nutmeg

Bake in pie plate 350° for 20 minutes. Double recipe in 8x13" pan, bake 25 to 40 minutes.

You can use peaches, rhubarb or berries.

Chicken-Mushroom Ragout

One 14 ½ ounce can reducedsodium chicken broth

1 tablespoon horseradish mustard

¼ teaspoon pepper

2 sprigs fresh thyme or ½ teaspoon dried thyme, crushed

4 boneless, skinless chicken thighs, cut into bite-sized pieces (12 ounces total)

8 ounces fresh mushrooms, halved (3 cups)

1 cup sliced carrots

1 cup water

1 cup slices leeks

2 tablespoons cornstarch

In a large dutch oven, combine chicken broth, mustard, thyme and pepper. Stir in chicken, mushrooms, carrots and leeks. Bring to boiling. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 15 minutes. Remove thyme sprigs, if using. Combine water and corn-

starch. Stir in chicken mixture. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly. Cock and stir for 2 more minutes more. Serve in bowls.
