Baby Grand Piano Donated to SHS Music Department

This last spring the children of Fred and Nola Parkinson donated the family baby grand piano to the Silverton High School Music Department.

Growing up, each of the Parkinson siblings Pennie Day (class of 1969), Fred (class of 1971), Shannon Montoya (class of 1974), Polly Briscoe (class of 1977), and Nicole Winnen (class of 1993) took piano lessons. The baby grand joined the family's spinet piano in time for Polly and Nicole to practice on it. Nola also played the piano occasionally. See the related story "The Parkinson Gulbransen Piano" for more on the background of this piano.

While working through items in their parents' estate, Pennie says she and her siblings realized that no one in the family had room in their own home for the piano. They then started looking into donating it to the Silverton Middle School. That didn't look like it was going to be feasible.

Since all five siblings were members of the Silverton High School Choralaires swing choir and Pennie and Fred recall practicing their parts with the piano, they thought maybe the high school would like it. With the help of Darby Hector, they approached Tim Duffy, music director at the high school. Mr. Duffy brought some of his students to the house to check it out. It was decided the high school would accept the donation.

After having a few minor repairs made, the piano was ready to be delivered to the high school in time for

the final band and choral concerts of the 2023-2024 school year. The piano was used at both of those concerts in May. Family members in attendance were recognized and thanked. A donation plaque has been added to the piano.

In addition to the piano itself, the Parkinson family gifted the moving and first tuning expenses along with a grand truck (dolly) for moving the piano.



Ernie and Eleanor Hento Scholarship Established

The family of Ernie and Eleanor Hento established a fund to provide an annual scholarship for Silverton High school graduates who are planning to attend either Washington State University or Oregon State University.

Ernie and Eleanor graduated from high schools in the State of Washington and then each went on to graduate from Washington State University (then called the State College of Washington) – Ernie in 1947 and Eleanor in 1950.

They married in 1952 and lived in Davenport, Washington where Ernie was a co-owner of a Western Auto store with one of his college friends. In 1961, Ernie and Eleanor decided to buy their own Western Auto hardware store in Silverton, Oregon. So, they packed up their family – son, Larry and daughter, Sheryl – and moved to Silverton.

While operating the store, Ernie also served on Silverton Hospital's Board of Directors, worked on the Elks Scholarship Committee, and volunteered at the Silverton Historical Society.

Eleanor helped Ernie at the store for several years, but with her children getting ready to go off to college, she decided to go back to school at Oregon College of Education (which is now Western Oregon University) to get her teaching credentials. In 1972, she got a job teaching 5th grade at Robert Frost Elementary School in Silverton and taught there until her retirement in 1987.

Ernie sold the Western Auto store in 1993 and could then be found volunteering at the Oregon Gardens when it was first open.

Both of Ernie and Eleanor's children graduated from Silverton Union High School and each went on to graduate from Oregon State University, as did two of their grandchildren. Additionally, both of Eleanor's parents graduated from OSU in the early/mid 1920's.

The Parkinson Gulbransen Piano

It is believed the Parkinson Gulbransen piano was originally purchased by George Hubbs from Steelhammer Drug in Silverton, known for years as "The Rexall Store." The store was located at 203 East Main Street, in the building occupied by the Bombay Club in 2024. George Hubbs operated a longtime real estate and insurance business during the first half of the twentieth century. Based on the piano's serial number, the piano was probably purchased sometime in the 1930s. While it may be difficult to imagine purchasing a piano from a drug store, George Steelhammer did, in fact, have a music department in his store.

The July 29, 1921 Silverton Appeal ran a story under the headline: "To Enlarge Drug Store," which reported "Mr. Steelhammer, who has an extensive business in musical merchandise, has for some time been crowded for room in which to display his pianos, graphahones (sic), etc. and the annex was the only possible way to expand." The article also stated space adjacent to the music room, that had housed the Silverton Variety Store, would now house the Hubbs Real Estate and Insurance business. which had relocated from its prior location on North Water Street.

Silverton held a Community Fair in 1924 that highlighted local businesses. A recently obtained photo from the Oregon Historical Society depicts the Steelhammer exhibit at the fair with a "Gulbransen Pianos" banner clearly visible in the background, confirming that Steelhammer sold Gulbransen pianos.

The Hubbs company stayed in the Steelhammer Drug building until 1936, when it leased the old Peoples Bank/First National Bank of Silverton



building, coincidentally owned by George Steelhammer, on the SW corner of East Main and South Water Streets.

Presumably, George Hubbs bought the piano in the 1930s and installed it in his home at 114 Coolidge Street. The piano sat at the Hubbs house for several decades. After a long career as a business and civic leader, George Hubbs passed away on January 24, 1950. His son, Max, relocated back to Silverton several months before his father's death to take over the Hubbs Company. He also moved into his father's house on Coolidge Street while his mother moved to a house on North Water Street.

Max Hubbs owned the Coolidge Street house until his death on May 24, 1968 while living in Carmel, California. Later, in 1968 or 1969, the contents of the Hubbs home were sold. Neighbors Fred and Nola Parkinson bought several items from the home, including a collection of books, some furniture, an Edison Grafonola, and the Gulbransen baby grand piano.

The piano resided in the Parkinson living room for about 55 years, until it was donated to the SHS Music Department in Spring 2024.

Unfortunately, the piano's origin can't be conclusively proven with sales receipts or other documentation. However, it's evident the two Georges (Steelhammer and Hubbs) knew each other well, since they were both business neighbors for many years, as well as prominent businessmen in the community of 2,500 residents. And since it's been verified that Steelhammer Drug sold Gulbranson

pianos, it's not too much of a stretch to conclude that George Steelhammer was able to sell George Hubbs one of his fine pianos.

David Hari received the Philip Clites Scholarship and will be studying Mechanical Engineering at Chemeketa Community College. Phil Clites was a teacher and volunteer tutor at Silverton High School. Several years ago, some of his former students established this scholarship to honor one of their favorite teachers. Phil continues to be connected to his former students by attending class reunions and luncheons for several classes that he taught. He was honored by SHSAA in 2002 with an honorary diploma from SHS for his commitment to the students of Silverton.

Clayton Schneider received the Doug Strom Scholarship and will be studying Finance and Accounting at Chemeketa Community College with a goal of graduating with a degree in Finance. The Doug Strom, Class of 1960, Memorial Scholarship was established by his wife, also SHS Class of 1960 Alum Donna Strom, to recognize a SHS graduate who demonstrates a belief in the value of hard work and seeks, through a strong entrepreneurial spirit, to succeed in private business.

Henry Schmitz was awarded the Clarence (SHS Class of 1947) and Norma Medack Scholarship and will be studying Agriculture and Food Business Management at Oregon State University. The Medack family managed their family farm in the Silverton area for several decades. The family made a donation to SHSAA in 2009 with the provision that a scholarship be awarded to an Alumnus who is pursuing an undergraduate degree in an agriculture related field.

Benjamin Scott received the Craig and Gladys Clark Scholarship and will be studying Psychology at Chemeketa Community College. Craig and Gladys moved to Silverton in 1944 when they purchased the Coast to Coast hardware store. They operated the store for 20 years before selling it to pursue other business opportunities. They returned to Silverton a few years later and worked together for Homeseekers Realty, later purchasing the company. Gladys was extremely involved in the Silverton community and was always working on some project to help others. If you were lucky enough to know Gladys, your life was somehow deeply affected and enriched. Her enthusiasm and spontaneity were contagious. After Gladys passed away in 2007, the Clark family made a significant donation to our Association with the provision that a scholarship be awarded to an Alumnus who is pursuing undergraduate studies in a community college.

The Wooden Nickel-Glen
Damewood Scholarship was
established by SHSAA to honor the
significant donations made to SHSAA
in providing catering services for
many years to SHSAA at the annual
Alumni and Friends Reunion party.
This year we awarded the scholarship
to Hailey Smith who will be
attending the University of Utah to
major in Business Marketing.

This year we awarded the Errol and Eaden Ross scholarships to graduating seniors Kira Bailey, Kylee Kern and Brylie Parks. Scholarships were also awarded to continuing college students Bjorn Domst and **Tyler Mansur.** Errol and Eaden Ross moved to Silverton in the 1930's. They owned and operated the Shell Oil service station business in Silverton from the 1930's until the 1980's. Their service station was located on the corner of First and Oak Streets in downtown Silverton (present location of Silverton Realty and the SHSAA office). Errol was a thrifty businessman and was involved in the development of the Eureka Acres subdivision on West Hill where a street bears his name today. The Rosses had a dream that someday there would be a scholarship fund large enough to send every graduate of Silverton High School to college. At the time of Errol's death in 1992, Eaden donated \$250,000 to establish the Errol W. and Eaden Ross Graduate Assistance Fund for graduates of SHS. She donated an additional \$240,000 from her estate upon her death in 1994. The fund merged with the SHS Alumni Association in 2009.

Leave a Lasting Legacy

Since 1967, the students of SHS have been beneficiaries of loans and scholarships from the estate of Dr. Peter and Marie Loar. Dr. Peter A Loar was the Silverton Health Officer from 1912 to 1949. He was a civic leader in town and was instrumental in establishing the Silverton Hospital and the Silver Falls State Park. He was also a leader in building the

community swimming pool, the city's water filtration plant, and the sewage system. He passed away in 1959 and at the time of his wife's death in 1966 she established, through her will, the P.A. and Marie B. Loar Student Loan Fund that was transferred to the Alumni Association in 2021. For more information on the life of Dr. Loar and his wife, check out their story in a two-part article in our June

2024 Class Challenge

The SHS Alumni Association
Scholarship fund is fueled by many
components, one of the most significant being the Class Challenge.
Initiated in 2017 by the Class of 1959,
this challenge encourages other
classes to compete in raising funds for
scholarships. The response has been
overwhelming, with numerous classes
participating each year and contributing substantially to the fund. Since
2017, the SHSAA Class Challenge has
raised an impressive \$262,000 for
scholarships.

SHSAA will be awarding Class Challenge scholarships in 2025 to three graduating seniors under the name of the Class of 1960 for \$1,500, Class of 1959 for \$1,000 and Class of 1961 for \$750. We extend our sincere gratitude to everyone who contributed this year to the Challenge!

You may donate using the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) donation from your IRA. Your donations may be tax deductible; **please consult your tax advisor**.


