## Silverton Alumni Association to Celebrate 30 Years in 2026

In 2026, the Silverton Alumni Association will celebrate 30 years, having begun in 1996. It started with a simple idea for holding extra reunion funds and providing scholarships to Silverton High graduates. Now, in addition to providing scholarships, we maintain a database of all SHS graduates, mail a newsletter twice a year, present honorary diplomas to people who show great support of SHS students, host an annual all class reunion party, assist classes planning their own reunions and most recently established a financial grant to the Music Department at SHS.

It has been through the efforts of many people volunteering their time and/or providing financial support through donations and dues that we have reached this milestone. Listed below are highlights of some memorable events to showcase our first thirty years:

**1993:** The class of 1963 Reunion Committee decides to create an alumni association to hold excess class funds between reunions, with interest to go towards scholarships. The Silver Fox Foundation agrees to hold the funds in their account until an alumni association can be legally created.

**1996:** The first formal meeting of the Silverton High School Alumni Association is held. The first scholarship of \$100 is awarded to

Emily Wallace. The first newsletter is published.

**1999:** First scholarship fundraiser dinner held at the Oregon Garden.

**2001:** First Honorary Diplomas awarded at SHS graduation.

**2004:** Articles of Incorporation recognized by the State of Oregon. SHSAA registered under the Oregon Charitable Trust and Corporation Act



and received approval of 501c3 tax exempt status from the IRS.

**2005:** SHSAA financial assets transferred from Silver Fox Foundation accounts to SHSAA accounts.

**2006:** SHSAA celebrates 10-year anniversary. Investment account principal is in excess of \$225,000. Awarded \$12,200 in scholarships to 22 graduates. Shsfoxes.com website created. A database of 13,000 alumni beginning with the class of 1908 is recognized.

**2008:** Scholarship Donor recognition program established with five levels of donors. Named scholarship program established. Given authorization from Wells Fargo Bank to evaluate applications and select recipients for their Loar Fund scholarship program.

**2009:** Two 501(c)(3) non-profit charitable scholarship funds co-existed in Silverton in the 1990's and 2000's, with the same mission of providing scholarships to SHS graduates: The Silverton High School Scholarship Fund and SHSAA. The trustees of both funds, with the concurrence of the Silver Falls School Board, agree to merge. The State of Oregon, Dept. of Justice agreed with the closing of the Silverton Scholarship Fund and transfer of assets to SHSAA. The investment account now stands at over \$800,000.

**2010:** SHSAA Facebook page started.

**2012:** Donor recognition plaque hung at Silverton High School.

**2013:** The investment account reaches \$1,000,000. SHSAA offered use of the display case at Silverton High School.

**2015:** Shsfoxes.com website updated.

**2016:** SHSAA celebrates 20-year anniversary. Awarded \$65,000 in scholarships to 70 graduates.

**2017:** Class Challenge donation program instigated by the class of 1959.

**2019:** Trustees agree to 3 named scholarships in recognition of the top 3 classes with donation totals in the Class Challenge.

**2020 & 2021:** The scholarship fundraiser dinner cancelled due to Covid-19. Loar Trust fund transferred from Wells Fargo to SHSAA.

**2024:** The investment account grows to over \$2,000,000.

**2025:** Awarded \$106,500 in scholarships to 67 graduates. By Laws revised to allow for establishment of a grant program. Funds donated to create the Doug & Donna Strom Music Grant to benefit the SHS choir and band programs. The shsfoxes.com website redesigned.

## 2026 Alumni and Friends Reunion Party

Mark your calendars for the 28<sup>th</sup> annual Alumni and Friends Reunion Party. Next year's party will be held on **Thursday evening, August 6, 2026**, at the Mt. Angel Festhalle.

When we submitted our request to reserve the Festhalle on our usual Friday of Homer Days weekend, we were told it had been rented to another group.

The Board of Trustees looked at our options – do we move our event to a different day of the week and stay at the Festhalle, or do we look at going back to the Oregon Garden.

We have enjoyed a discounted rental rate at both locations in the past, however, this year we were informed that would no longer be available for a Friday night rental. The weekend rental rate at the Festhalle is double what it would be for a Monday-Thursday rental.

Ultimately, the Board decided that the Festhalle best meets our needs for parking and accessibility. We chose to move the event to Thursday night ahead of the Homer Days weekend. This also eliminates the conflict with First Friday events in downtown Silverton.

## Leave a Lasting Legacy: The SHSAA Named Scholarship Program

There are many ways to make a significant impact on our scholarship program and one of the most meaningful ways is through our Named Scholarship Program. Donors who contribute a minimum of \$20,000 can establish a perpetual scholarship in honor of a loved one – a family member, friend, or favorite teacher – ensuring their legacy lives on and supports future generations of deserving students. These scholarships can be established during the donor's lifetime or through a Will or Trust upon the donors passing. We are incredibly grateful for the generosity of our named scholarship donors and are proud to share their stories with the community during the scholarship awards presentation ceremony as well as with the readers of this newsletter.

We awarded two brand new named scholarships this past spring, thanks to the generosity of the families of Ernie and Eleanor Hento and Dorothy Nathman. The **Ernie and Eleanor Hento Scholarship** was awarded to 2025 SHS graduate **Lauren Gilkison** who will be studying Physical Therapy at Oregon State University. Ernie and Eleanor Hento owned and managed the Western Auto hardware store on Water Street in Silverton for 32 years. While operating the store, Ernie also served on Silverton Hospital's Board of Directors, worked on the Elks Scholarship Committee, and volunteered at the Silverton Historical Society.

Eleanor helped Ernie at the store for several years, until 1972 when she got a job teaching 5th grade at Robert Frost Elementary School in Silverton and taught there until her retirement in 1987. The family has requested that this scholarship be awarded to a student attending either Washington

State University or Oregon State University because of the Hento family's strong multi-generational association with both universities.

The **Dorothy Nathman Nursing Scholarships** were awarded to 2025 SHS graduates **Brooklyn Pfeifer** and **Jocelyn Wavra**. Brooklyn will be studying Nursing at Linfield University and Jocelyn will be studying Nursing at Boise State University. Dorothy Marie Nathman was born to Joseph and Sophia Nathman on October 24, 1906 in Gervais, Oregon. She was the first daughter and second child of a family which grew to six children, two girls and four boys. The family moved early in Dorothy's life to Woodburn where Joseph started Nathman Hardware on Front Street which was in business for several decades.

Dorothy left home at 16 to enroll at St. Vincent's Nursing School. She was among the youngest of her class but did well and graduated with excellent marks in 1927 at the age of 20. After graduation, she traveled with a few friends to Los Angeles for work but found the city not to her liking and after a brief period, returned to Portland and was hired by St Vincent's Hospital as full-time staff. She enjoyed the city life, often in the company of her sister Ernestine "Ernie". She was adventurous, even climbing Mt Hood in the late 1920's and as a tall, young lady with attention grabbing thick red hair, had a number of suitors. The man who eventually won her heart was a new doctor doing his Internship at St Vincent's, Clement Ebner, and they married after a short courtship in December, 1930. After a short stay in Chicago for additional training, Clement and Dorothy settled in Mt Angel and almost immediately started a family. Their first of 9 children was born in 1932 and last in 1949 when Dorothy was 42.

Raising her children dominated her life but she always seemed to find time to volunteer whenever the Red Cross needed a nurse or a vaccination clinic needed help and was very proud to put on her nurse's cap.

She passed suddenly at the age of 62 from a cardiac event.

It is the family's hope that this scholarship will help young women and men take up the challenge of a nursing career to help fill this ever-increasing need in health care.

SHS 2025 graduate, **John Hurley**, received the **Bill Dibala Scholarship**. John is attending Oregon State University studying Psychology. His goal is to become a speech pathologist, helping people with developmental disabilities obtain resources to communicate with confidence. Bill Dibala's family made a significant donation to honor him following his death in the spring of 2013. Bill was born with Down Syndrome and lived 70 long years enjoying his work, the outdoors, people and his God. He had wonderful experiences at Camp Upward Bound which is a summer camp serving the needs of people with disabilities and their caregivers.

This scholarship is awarded annually to an SHS alumnus pursuing a degree that could lead to helping individuals with special needs. Thank you to the Dibala Family for their generous donation!

**Matthew Bielenberg** received the **Philip Clites Scholarship** and will be studying Engineering at Chemeketa Community College. Phil Clites was a former teacher and volunteer tutor at Silverton High School. Several years ago, some of his former students established this scholarship to honor one of their favorite teachers. Phil continues to be connected to his former students by attending class reunions and luncheons for several classes that he taught. He was honored by SHSAA in 2002 with an honorary diploma from SHS for his commitment to the students of Silverton.

**JD Arthur** received the **Doug Strom Scholarship** and will be studying Business at Western Oregon University. The Doug Strom, Class of 1960, Memorial Scholarship was established by his wife, also SHS Class of 1960 Alum Donna Strom, to

recognize an SHS graduate who demonstrates a belief in the value of hard work and seeks, through a strong entrepreneurial spirit, to succeed in private business.

**Makayla Rose** was awarded the **Clarence (SHS Class of 1947) and Norma Medack Scholarship** and will be studying Agriculture Business Management at Corban University. The Medack family managed their family farm in the Silverton area for several decades. The family made a donation to SHSAA in 2009 with the provision that a scholarship be awarded to an Alumnus who is pursuing an undergraduate degree in an agriculture related field.

**Ashley Schurter** received the **Craig and Gladys Clark Scholarship** and will be studying Emergency Medical Services at Chemeketa Community College. Craig and Gladys moved to Silverton in 1944 when they purchased the Coast to Coast hardware store. They operated the store for 20 years before selling it to pursue other business opportunities. They returned to Silverton a few years later and worked together for Homeseekers Realty, later purchasing the company. Gladys was extremely involved in the Silverton community and was always working on some project to help others. If you were lucky enough to know Gladys, your life was somehow deeply affected and enriched. Her enthusiasm and spontaneity were contagious. After Gladys passed away in 2007, the Clark family made a significant donation to our Association with the provision that a scholarship be awarded to an Alumnus who is pursuing undergraduate studies at a community college.

**The Wooden Nickel-Glen Damewood Scholarship** was established by SHSAA to honor the significant donations made to SHSAA in providing catering services for many years to SHSAA at the annual Alumni and Friends Reunion party. This year we awarded the scholarship

to **Jacob Lahman** who will be attending Chemeketa Community College to major in Fire Suppression.

This year we awarded the **Errol and Eaden Ross scholarships** to 2025 graduating seniors **Ryder Britton, Elias Eubanks and Trevor Redman-Brown**. Scholarships were also awarded to continuing college students **Bjorn Domst, Kirsten Kuenzi and Marissa Johnston**. Errol and Eaden Ross moved to Silverton in the 1930's. They owned and operated the Shell Oil and service station business in Silverton from the 1930's until the 1980's. Their service station was located on the corner of First and Oak Streets in downtown Silverton (present location of Silverton Realty and the SHSAA office). Errol was a thrifty businessman and was involved in the development of the Eureka Acres subdivision on West Hill where a street bears his name today. The Rosses had a dream that someday there would be a scholarship fund large enough to send every graduate of Silverton High School to college. At the time of Errol's death in 1992, Eaden donated \$250,000 to establish the Errol W. and Eaden Ross Graduate Assistance Fund for graduates of SHS. She donated an additional \$240,000 from her estate upon her death in 1994. The fund merged with the SHS Alumni Association in 2009.

Recipients of the **Dr. Peter and Marie Loar scholarships** were 2025 graduates **Brody Kuenzi, Madelyn Stolfus and Audrey Gardner** and SHS Alumni **Joanne Noordman, Heather Pool and Henry Schmitz**. Since 1967, the students of SHS have been beneficiaries of loans and scholarships from the Estate of Dr. Peter and Marie Loar. Dr. Peter A Loar was the Silverton Health Officer from 1912 to 1949. He was a civic leader in town and was instrumental in establishing the Silverton Hospital and the Silver Falls State Park. He was also a leader in building the community swimming pool, the city's water filtration plant, and the sewage system. He passed away in 1959 and at the time of his wife's death in 1966 she established, through her will, the

P.A. and Marie B. Loar Student Loan Fund that was transferred to the Alumni Association in 2021.

## Strom Music Grant Awards First Money

In his application to the Trustees, Erik Nelson, SHS Band Director, described their proposal as: "Our project is entitled 'Building a collaborative combined band and choir repertoire library.' This application seeks funding to create and fill a new category of repertoire in our music library which will allow for direct collaboration between band and choir students. We aim to be able to study and perform the same music together, which will provide these students with meaningful musical experiences, as well as provide enriching and memorable events for the local community. This project is designed to be ongoing in perpetuity with multiple collaborative concerts taking place between the band and choir throughout the school year and future years to come in both on-campus and off-campus venues."

The Trustees see this as a wonderful opportunity for the students and awarded the first grant to the SHS Music Department. As of this writing, music has been purchased and performances are planned at combined concerts during the school year.

## 2025 Scholarship Recipients

Since our first scholarship award of \$100 in 1996 the Silverton High School Alumni Association has awarded over \$1.7 million in scholarships to Silverton High School graduates. This past year we received an impressive number of scholarship applications for the 2025-26 school year. Once all the final applications were processed, \$106,500 was awarded to students. One of the highlights for us each year is being able to personally congratulate our senior scholarship award recipients in person during the SHS Senior Class Awards ceremony. It was a pleasure to award a total of \$47,000 to 27 graduating seniors at the awards ceremony on May 30. The Class of 2025 received an impressive amount of awards this year in addition to the SHSAA scholarships. In addition to the scholarships awarded to the Class of 2025 graduates, we also awarded \$59,500 to 40 alumni currently attending college. Congratulations to all our scholarship recipients!

## Honorary Diplomas

Honorary Diplomas were presented to Geralyn Sheets and Doug Ousterhout at the 2025 Graduation ceremony.

### Geralyn Sheets

While working primarily in community nursing, she was attracted to an ad in the local newspaper asking for a part-time teacher and Nurse at Silverton High School. With some hesitancy, because of her lack of teaching experience, she applied and was pleasantly surprised to learn of her acceptance as the School Nurse Consultant and Instructor for the Health Occupations Program. She started in late September, 2002. As the School Nurse, she has seen students through seizures, diabetic emergencies, athletic injuries, shop injuries and Covid 19. Her Nurse and Teacher "dual career" expertise is also clearly demonstrated by the success of the Health Occupations Program where she annually mentors, advises and counsels 20-25 students as they explore careers in healthcare, primarily by job shadow rotations in the Silverton medical community. A large percentage of her students continue in a healthcare career. To her extreme credit many of her former students return to the community as a nurse, physician, dental hygienist or other medical professional.

Geralyn retired from her SHS position in June 2024 but returned in the fall of 2025 as a substitute teacher with emphasis on continuing the Health Occupations Program. She is also the advisor for the Health Sciences club, where club members participate and organize various healthcare activities including three Red Cross Blood drives, visits to Davenport House, teaching at the preschool and assisting with vision screenings at the elementary schools.

### Doug Ousterhout

Between the years 1990 and 2024 Silverton High School saw six superintendents, a dozen principals, six vocal music directors, five band directors, an untold number of English, math and social studies teachers...and one Theater teacher. Doug Ousterhout was hired in the fall of 1990 to teach Special Education and to direct Theater Productions. When he asked the Superintendent for the Theater Director's job description he was told, "direct 2 or 3 plays a year". Mr. O took that as an open book and created the SHS Theater Program. For his first show, 13 students auditioned. 12 got parts, the other student became the Stage Manager. The growth of the program began slowly and eventually evolved into comedies, dramas, full musicals, Shakespeare, student written and directed plays, a full curriculum of theater classes and the very successful Children's Theater Program.

During his 35-year tenure with the Silver Falls School district, Mr. O taught Special Education, Alternative Education, Physical Education, Health, and Unified PE. He also taught courses in Introduction to Theater, Advanced Theater, Children's Theater, Writing and Middle school Theater. Mr. O's greatest success has been the many young and talented students that found their voice; not just in theater but in life.

I want to thank you again for all the support you have given my fellow alumni and I in the previous years. Your scholarship is greatly appreciated and has made a great impact on my college education to further my future career path in business.
